CHARTER FOR THE NATIONAL WA1500 MATCH DIRECTOR

It is the purpose of this Charter to provide Pistol Australia with the rules governing the formation and management role for the position of National WA1500 Match Director.

1. **NAME:** National WA1500 Match Director.
2. **OBJECTIVE:** To develop and promote WA1500 Match shooting throughout Australia.
3. **DIRECTOR:** The Director will be elected for a period of two (2) years.

The position of Director shall be filled by election at the Annual General Meeting of Pistol Australia Inc. Nominations may be accepted from any member of Pistol Australia.

The Director's responsibility is to propose and/or recommend amendments to the regulations for the operations of WA1500 Match Shooting, which will be submitted to Pistol Australia Management for consideration.

4. **FINANCE:** To be provided by:
 - i. Pistol Australia; and
 - ii. Other sources

5. **SPECIAL CLAUSE:**

Once WA1500 Match shooting has become an operationally self-sufficient Pistol Australia competition, the position of WA1500 Match Director may become redundant.

In such event a decision on any action required will be made by the Executive Committee at the appropriate time.

REGULATIONS TO THE CHARTER FOR THE NATIONAL WA1500 MATCH DIRECTOR

1. AIM:

To achieve the objectives set out in the Charter for the WA1500 Match Director by:

- 1.01 the development and promotion of WA1500 Match shooting to Pistol Australia members and the community, particularly through the shooting media and competitions;
- 1.02 the assessment, planning and development of WA1500 Match shooting and ensuring compatibility with international practices; and
- 1.03 monitoring the activities of the State WA1500 Match Directors where appointed.

2. MANAGEMENT:

The WA1500 Match Director shall have responsibility to:

- 2.01 liaise with PA State WA1500 Match Directors and encourage all States to develop and promote WA1500 Match shooting;
- 2.02 recommend guidelines for the conduct of National WA1500 Match Championships;
- 2.03 recommend a National Standard for the training and accreditation of Pistol Australia members for the safe and proficient handling of pistols whilst participating in WA1500 Match shooting events and modifications as and when required;
- 2.04 make submissions to the NRC and NCC for programmes to enable NRC and NCC accreditation for WA1500 Match shooting;
- 2.05 recommend to and consult with the NRC to establish National guidelines and interpretations of WA1500 Match shooting Rules;
- 2.06 formulate and recommend a plan for the establishment of a National Squad (WA1500 Match shooting);
- 2.07 submit timely reports on WA1500 Match shooting activities to Pistol Australia Management, PA State WA1500 Match Directors and the *Australian Pistol Shooters Bulletin*;
- 2.08 submit a detailed report to PA Management within 30 days of any WA1500 Match shooting activity that involved expenditure in excess of \$250.00;
- 2.09 develop a budget for WA1500 Match shooting for timely submission to Pistol Australia Management;
- 2.10 report to Pistol Australia Management on performance against budget as and when required;
- 2.11 report to each Pistol Australia Management meeting and also annually at the Annual General Meeting of Pistol Australia Inc., on WA1500 Match shooting activities; and
- 2.12 carry out such matters or things as are conducive to or incidental to WA1500 Match shooting activities.

3. MISCELLANEOUS:

- 3.01 Amendment to these Regulations will be by way of recommendation to Pistol Australia for consideration.
